

Alternatively, take part online by clicking on the image and following the link..


Set a reading goal and log your books on your profile. When you reach your goal you will unlock a limited-edition online badge and certificate!

# Home/School Family Support in the summer holidays.

Some families may require support over the summer holidays, our home/school family support worker Justine Fitzer will be working over the summer to provide support if needed.

Justine has worked in the area for over eighteen years. She knows the journey of being a parent can take its twists and turns, and sometimes, we all need a little help along the way, that is what she is here for. If she can't help you, she will know somebody who can.

Justine's role is to work closely with children and families who may be experiencing difficulties. She listens and appreciates parent/carer issues and can offer suggestions and advice for individuals and families.

She can work with and support families during key school transitions including newcomers and moving to middle school. She works with families who are going through difficult times including relationship breakdown, bereavement and mental health issues. In consultation with parents/carers she can support children on a 1:1 basis (in school or in their home) or in a group, listening and working with them in different ways on managing their emotions, developing social skills and building their confidence
